<u>Sewer</u> – Hoy asked if we have a policy in place for collection of late sewer bills. Hill stated she set up a payment plan to bring those delinquent customers up to date before the next quarter billings.

<u>Streets</u> – Dion questioned the soapy water running from the house on the corner of West Fourth and Allison. Bill answered it is a yard drain that runs into the street. EJ Brenneman will come in within the next couple of months to correct the James Street micro-seal issue.

<u>Recreation</u> – Saw dust placed at the park. Moved the flag pole closer to the dugout/concessions. Bill reported on the County flag for the War Memorial. The Commissioners is charging \$65 for the flag—in the past they provided them at no cost.

<u>Personnel</u> – Resignation has been received May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2009 from Laborer Shawn Smith. Personnel Committee reviewed previous applicants. Committee is recommending Jamie Nyman who was interviewed along with the first applicants as received in November. Shope questioned a possible conflict of interest with the Personnel Committee since Mr. Nyman is the son-in-law of one of the committee members. Borough Code does not consider this a conflict of interest. Brungard requests vacation May 21, June 29 & 30 and July 1 & 2.

<u>Finance</u> – LaRocque reported on Act 32. The School District agreed that they would control all decisions on the new committee. LaRocque asked what the School Districts plans are for the new tax office, and there were no plans as of yet. A committee will be formed in July of reps from the municipalities. LaRocque has volunteered to be a part of that committee.

<u>Community Development</u> – County has signed for the First Church of Christ subdivision. The Parsonage has been sold under the assumption that is had been subdivided. However, the subdivision appears to have never been recorded. Therefore, the plans will be reviewed by the Borough Planning Commission and following that Council will review the plans for final approval.

<u>2009 Street Project</u> – Bids were received as follows: R.C. Bowman - \$83,656.16; Hawbaker - \$63,257.60; HRI, Inc. - \$75,636; Charles Construction - \$86,340.30; Wolf Excavating - \$97,968.05. Municipal PennDOT Rep Dennis Folmar reviewed the bids and recommended awarding Hawbaker the project at \$63,257.60.

<u>Unit Debt Analysis</u> – Grimm motioned to contract with Brinjac for completion of the Unit Debt Analysis at a maximum of \$2,500.

Grimm recommended hiring Jamie Nyman with a 60-day probation period. Mr. Nyman is able to begin work on Monday. Dion motioned to hire Nyman to fill the position; Grimm Seconded. # **NEW BUSINESS**

<u>Flag Pole</u> – Placed in Right-of-Way at the corner of Allison and West Fourth. The Mayor and Brungard painted the site triangle in the location for Mr. Keyser's information. He was informed as was property owner Bill Gebhardt that the pole must be moved out of the site triangle. The Express was notified by Mr. Keyser of the situation; the Borough provided the Express with a copy of the ordinance noting noncompliance.

<u>Operator's License</u> – Brungard is being required by DEP to obtain his Class E Operator's License. Brungard is to contact Gibson or Bailey for additional information.

<u>Committees</u> – Mayor Durkin is requesting that he be notified of all Committee Meetings so that he may have the option to attend. He has been notified by PSAB that he is not counted as part of a quorum for such meetings. Council agreed that he be notified of such meetings.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Sewer</u> – Bids for the Hill Section Sewer Rehabilitation Project will be opened Monday, June 22<sup>nd</sup>. Shope questioned the requirement of the third engineer. Gensib stated that Grimm will address this at the next Sewer Authority Meeting. Shope asked who is requiring it, and Hoy answered PennVest.

Streets – Paving project complete. Joints were sealed today. It was estimated by PennDot that 1033 tons of asphalt would be needed; 1036 tons were put down. Shope questioned the status of snow guards being required at Killingers. Brungard reported Mr. Killinger agrees to keep the streets free of snow from his roof.

<u>Recreation</u> – The Committee met with Steve and Joel from Brinjac to go over the perimeter of the park and the projects anticipated. A survey of the park will be conducted and continuance on the project is expected in mid-July.

<u>Personnel</u> – Brungard reported that training of new employee going ok. Career Link will begin orientation on June 11<sup>th</sup>.

Public Comment – Fire Police Report: Gensib reported that the Station 48 Fire Police is non-functional and is not being dispatched at this time by the Com Center. Hoy concerned with how the badge reads "municipality" and "Fire Co." Durkin asked how the Borough knows who is liable. Hoy announced his support for a Fire Police Task Force.

# REGULAR MINUTES June 11, 2009

President Pat Gensib called Flemington Borough Council meeting held Thursday, June 11, 2009, at 7:00 p.m. to order. Roll call showed the following Council present: Grimm; Hoy; Hill; Shope; Gensib; Dion; LaRocque and Mayor Durkin. Also present were Borough Resident Charles Keyser, Deputy Fire Chief Jonathan Temple and Engineer Steve Gibson.

The minutes of the May 2009 Meetings were approved with corrections to the bid amounts as printed.

# **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

Charles Keyser attended the meeting to discuss placement of his flag pole at the corner of Allison and West Fourth Streets. Mr. Keyser reported that Council and Employees informed him he was required to remove the pole. Council informed Mr. Keyser that that is not the case. Grimm stated that he was simply asked to move it out of the site triangle and borough right-of-way, which was communicated to the property owner Bill Gebhardt in writing. After lengthy discussion, Council agreed that Mr. Keyser must move the pole from the site triangle and borough right-of-way.

Gibson reported on the bid status for the Hill Section Sewer Rehabilitation Project. He announced that there are currently 22 plan holders. He added that the PennVest closing date has been pushed back due to miscommunication and the MBE (Minority Business Enterprise) changes. He is suggesting that since Council is opening the bids on June 22<sup>nd</sup>, they hold a Special Meeting to award the bids on June 25<sup>th</sup>. Shope questioned the bill for 3<sup>rd</sup> party review – Innovative Consulting Group—asking why only Flemington and Bald Eagle are included. Gibson answered that Woodward Township is not anticipating a need for funding. Gibson added that he reviewed the hours being proposed by Innovative Consulting Group and feels they are acceptable but that Innovative will be required to submit detailed reports for time submitted for payment. Gibson recommended we sign the agreement with Innovative Consulting Group. He also informed Council that we should hear about the award for the H2O Grant around July 14<sup>th</sup>.

Deputy Fire Chief for Goodwill Hose Fire Company No. 7, Jonathan Temple attended the meeting to give the fire report for the year. He reported 25 calls this year. He added that they are seeking a \$14,000 State Fire Grant and have already received \$9,000 for engine equipment and fire tools. They are in the process of trying to get the brush truck operational. They have applied for and are awaiting a response on a Federal Grant for 750,000 to replace the FWD for a new engine and rescue. Jonathan would like to attend the Council meetings each month to give an update of their happenings and asked that Council let him know what they would like to know about the fire company as well.

Gensib introduced new employee Jamie Nyman to Council.

### REPORTS OF OFFICERS:

<u>Permits</u>: Chaplain reported that 3 zoning permits were issued since the last meeting. Ordinance Enforcement Officer (OEO):

<u>Planning Commission</u> – Subdivision has been approved by the County. Borough Planning Commission did not have a quorum. Borough Code states that Council has 45 days from application to review and approve. Grimm motioned to approve; Hill seconded. Hoy questioned the distance between the back of the church and the line. The church is located in a Commercial Zone; therefore, it can be on the line. Roll call vote unanimously approved the subdivision. Shope expressed her interest in serving on the Planning Commission.

# SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES June 25, 2009

Gibson presented Council with the final four lowest bid results as follows:

Doli Construction Corporation 626,255.00 (reflects calculation correction)

Continental Construction, Inc. 476,349.60

R.C. Bowman Inc. 451,736.25 (apparent low bidder)

Gibson contacted Bowmans (the apparent low bidder) in reference to their substantially low bid. He added that all of their paperwork is in order. However, they will need to revise their DBE (Disadvantaged Business Enterprise) Solicitation per DEP guidelines. Bowmans have confirmed that they are comfortable with their bid as submitted. Gibson suggested to Council that they hire a full-time inspector to oversee the job for the duration of the project. Grimm asked if the Borough has an ordinance in place to require replacement of laterals with infiltration. Chaplain will check the ordinances for this. If an ordinance does not exist, Charity will obtain a copy of Woodward Township's Ordinance. Grimm motioned to award the Hill Section Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation Project to R.C. Bowman for the amount of \$451,736.25, contingent upon their abilities to obtain DBE approval from DEP by the end of July of 2009 upon recommendation from Brinjac, Inc.; Hoy seconded. Motion was unanimously carried.
